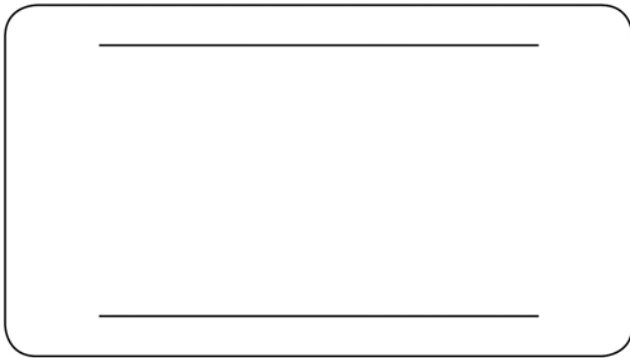


Material

- ◆ Template copies
- ◆ Round tip pair of scissors
- ◆ Colour pencils

Instructions

- ◆ Review the vocabulary related to feelings with the children.
- ◆ Hand out the template copies. Tell the children to paint the faces and the words.
- ◆ Help them cut down the emotion metre and the pointer, including its internal lines.
- ◆ Now help them slide the emotion metre through the pointer. Ask them to tell you how they are feeling and show the corresponding face.

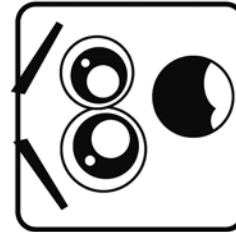

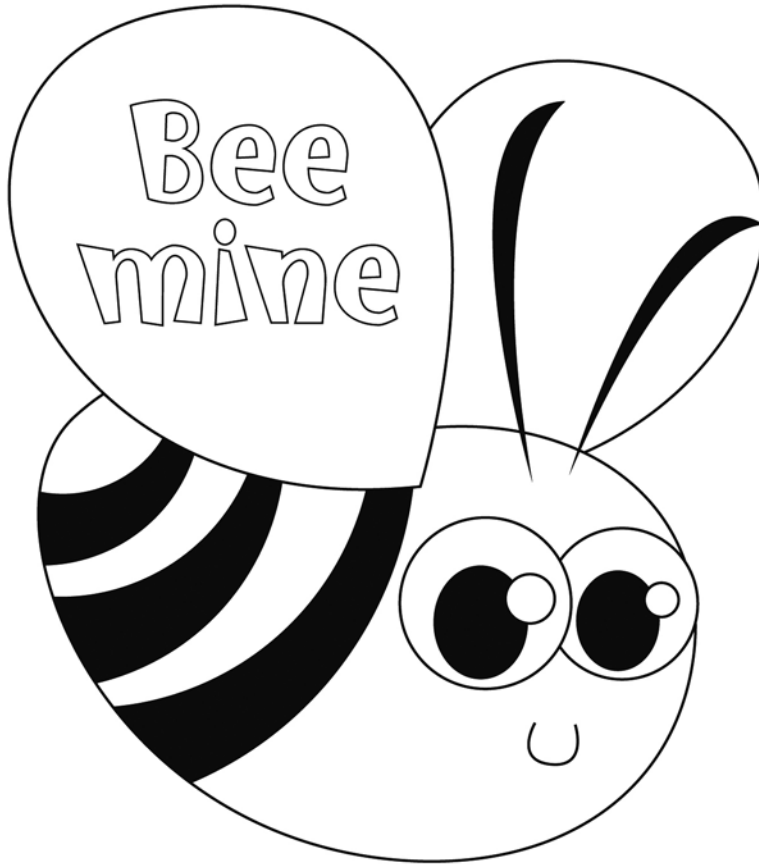
Material

- ◆ Template copies
- ◆ Colour felt-tip pens or crayons
- ◆ Round tip pair of scissors
- ◆ White glue
- ◆ Nylon or cotton thread
- ◆ Colour bead
- ◆ Metal or plastic ring

Instructions

- ◆ Review with the children what they know about Valentine's Day.
- ◆ Hand out template copies to the children and ask them to paint the bees any colour they want and then, cut them down.
- ◆ Help them pass the thread through the bees to make up a mobile.
- ◆ Explain to the children that they will have to tie one end of the thread to the ring and insert the colour bead to fix it.

Suggestion: This mobile can be located near a window to be blown by the wind.

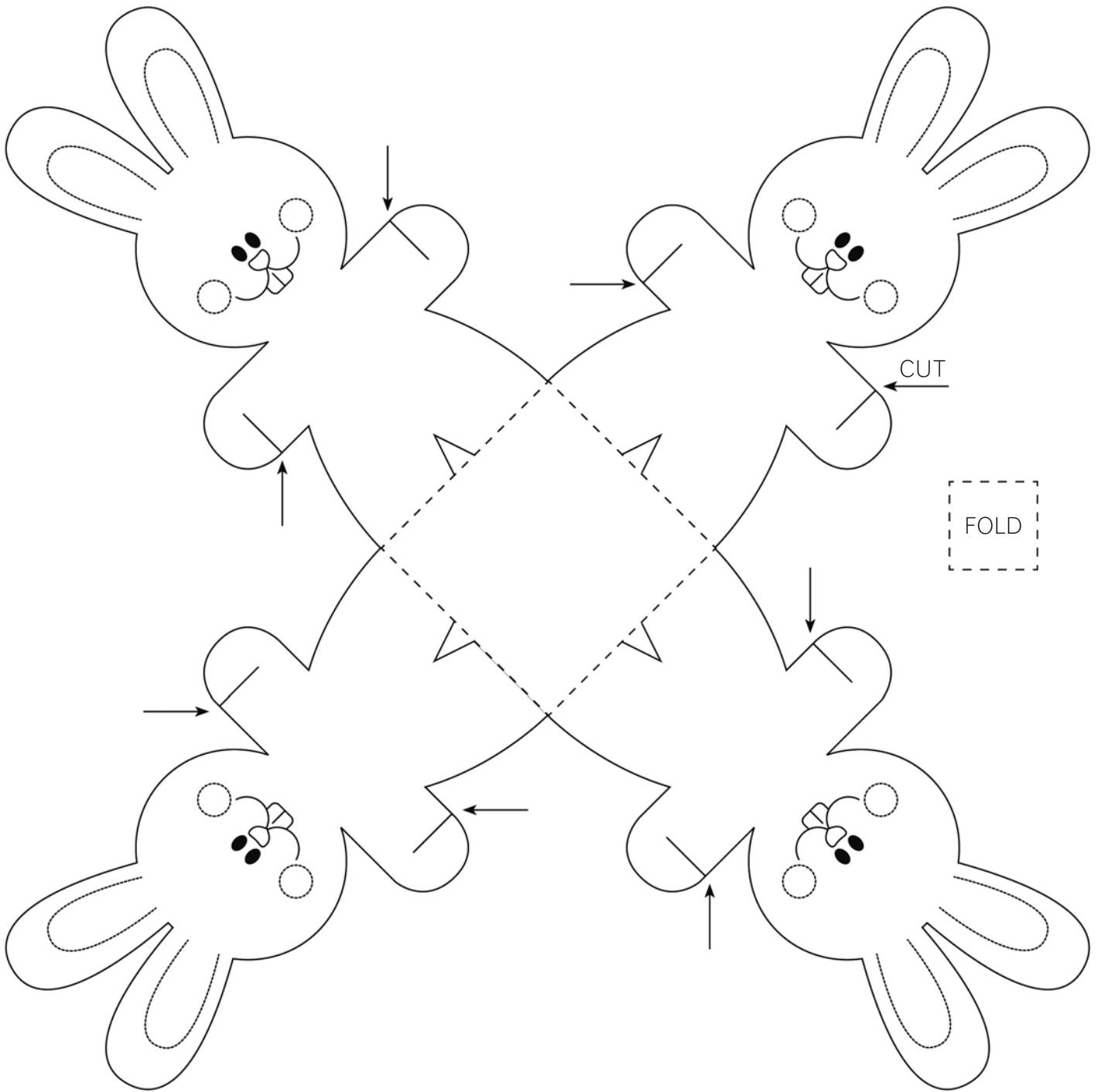


Material

- ◆ Template copies
- ◆ Colour felt-tip pens or pencils
- ◆ Round tip pair of scissors
- ◆ Narrow coloured ribbon piece (15 cm)

Instructions

- ◆ Explain to the children they will assemble an Easter basket to celebrate Easter.
- ◆ Hand out template copies to the children ask them to paint the pictures and cut them down.
- ◆ Help them assemble the basket: fold along the dotted lines in such a way that the bunnies figures form the outer side of the basket and mount the arms on the marks shown.
- ◆ Tell the children to paint the card as desired.
- ◆ Now ask them to make a hole in the card and pass the ribbon piece through it to tie it to the basket.



Material

- ◆ Empty, clean glass jar
- ◆ Colour glass paint
- ◆ Small coloured stones or sea salt
- ◆ Small candle (3 to 5 cm tall)
- ◆ Round tip pair of scissors
- ◆ Colour felt-tip pens
- ◆ Narrow coloured ribbon piece (30 cm)

Instructions

- ◆ Explain to the children they will make a *candle holder* for their mums for *Mother's Day*.
- ◆ Tell them to paint the glass jar and let it dry.
- ◆ Now tell them to put the small stones or sea salt at the bottom and place the candle.
- ◆ Ask them to decorate and cut the card and explain the meaning of the message establishing the analogy with the candle.
- ◆ Help them tie in the coloured ribbon piece around the candle holder.



Material

- ◆ Food can
- ◆ Wooden lolly sticks
- ◆ Sticky adhesive tape
- ◆ White glue
- ◆ Coloured ribbon piece (20 cm)

Instructions

- ◆ Explain to the children that they will make a pencil holder for their dad for *Father's Day*.
- ◆ Tell them to place one wooden lolly stick next to another and hold them together with the help of sticky adhesive tape. The quantity of sticks required will depend on the size of the can.
- ◆ Help the children cover the can with the lolly sticks leaving the adhesive tape on the inside.
- ◆ Finally, instruct them to tie the can with the ribbon.



Material

- ◆ Cardboard template copies
- ◆ Round tip pair of scissors
- ◆ White glue
- ◆ Various materials to decorate the tree (sequins, beads, stickers in different shapes, etc.)

Instructions

- ◆ Explain to the children they will make a *Christmas tree* to decorate their classroom for Christmas.
- ◆ Hand out template copies and ask the children to cut the figures, including the dotted lines.
- ◆ Tell them to decorate the tree with the materials they want.
- ◆ Finally, help them assemble the tree, mounting both parts carefully.
